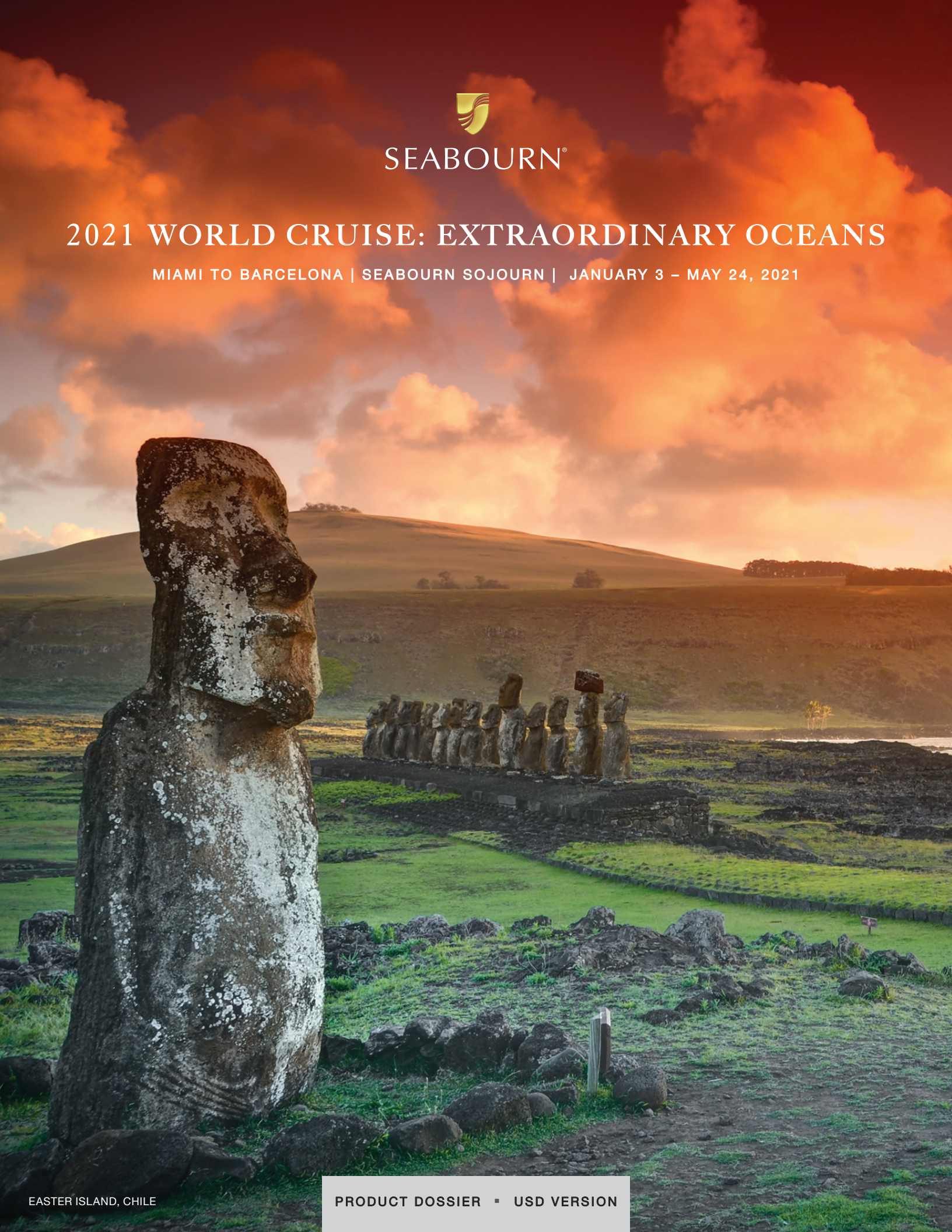

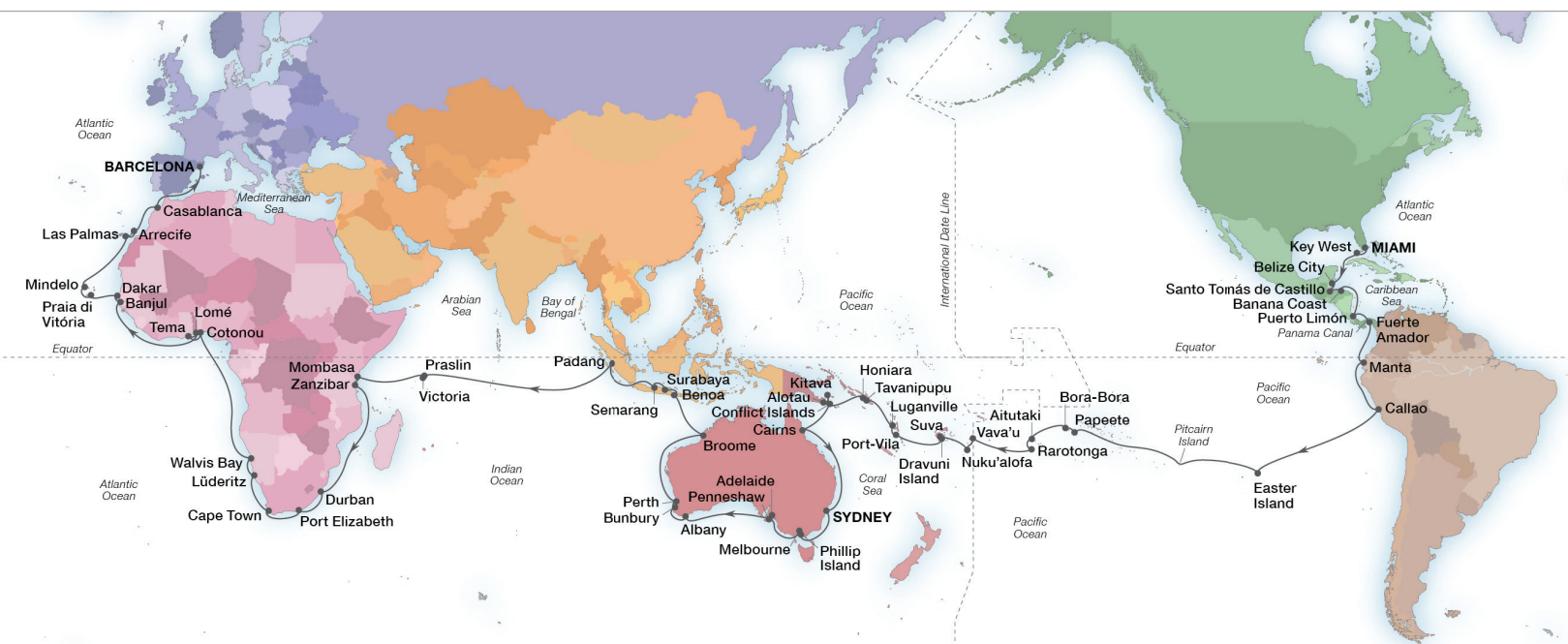

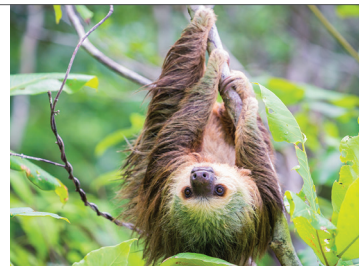
Santo Tomás de Castilla, Guatemala

Guatemala's Caribbean port on the Gulf of Honduras was protected from pirate attacks by the fortified, 16th-century Castillo de San Felipe. Guatemala is the heartland of the Mayan empire, and nearby Quirigua is a UNESCO World Heritage Site with numerous monuments and, most unusually, a river running right through it. The community of Livingston is a treasury of the unique Garifuna culture that grew from a blend of African and indigenous Guatemalan people.



Puerto Limón (San José), Costa Rica

Visit the canopy of Costa Rica's Caribbean coastal rain forest by aerial cable gondolas at the Veragua Rain Forest Park, which also offers zip-line adventures. Thread the mangrove forests of the Tortuguero Canal to see sloths, monkeys and numerous varieties of birds and reptiles. Visitors often tour one of the area's banana plantations, or head inland to the cosmopolitan capital, San José, just over two hours away by highway through highland coffee plantations.



Panama Canal Transit

A thrilling day you will never forget. Surrounded by ships of every sort from every corner of the globe, your ship is gracefully lifted by inrushing water in huge locks, and then sails through jungled channels and across a shining lake from one ocean to another, as an expert Canal Authority guide relates the history, mechanics and other facts. At the other end, the waters ease your ship downward to rejoin a different sea, with memories to last a lifetime.



Manta (Quito), Ecuador (overnight)

Manta is a world center for tuna fishing, and its beaches attract surfers and windsurfers worldwide. The national capital of Quito is a Spanish colonial UNESCO World Heritage Site located right on the Equator, among Andean peaks at over 9,500 feet. From Manta, you can opt to join Seabourn Overland Excursions to either Cuzco and the ancient Inca mountaintop site of Machu Picchu or the natural splendors and enchanting wildlife of Ecuador's Galápagos Islands.



Callao (Lima), Peru (overnight)

From the port of Callao, visit the "City of Kings." Spain's prime American capital, Lima is a UNESCO World Heritage Site prized for great palaces, baroque churches, broad plazas and art treasures blending classical forms with native traditions. The Museo Larco is an outstanding collection of pre-Columbian gold and silver artifacts and exquisite pottery. An overnight stay invites sampling the city's renowned culinary scene, or an Overland Excursion to the mountaintop Inca site of Machu Picchu.



Easter Island, Chile (overnight)

Tiny Easter Island is one of the most remote places on earth. Chile's Rapa Nui National Park preserves the sculptural heritage of the indigenous Rapa Nui whose ancestors carved the huge moai effigies that gaze implacably out to sea, earning the island UNESCO World Heritage Site status. During your two-day stay, Expedition Team experts will enlighten you on their significance, the Rapa Nui people themselves, and the volcanic landscape of this speck in the world's largest ocean.



Adamstown, Pitcairn Island (Scenic Cruising)

As you cross the world's largest ocean, your Captain will provide you a panoramic survey of one of earth's most remote communities. The inhabitants of Pitcairn Island are descendants of mutineers who commandeered the Royal Navy ship *HMS Bounty* in 1789. The four volcanic islands in the group comprise the only Overseas Territory of the United Kingdom in the Pacific.



Papeete, Tahiti, French Polynesia (overnight)

The capital of French Polynesia bustles in a laid-back, South Pacific way. The red spire of Notre Dame Cathedral rises near the waterfront. The narrow streets are crowded and lined with shops, galleries and restaurants. The nearby Robert Wan Pearl Museum is a good place to learn about cultured Tahitian pearls. Your two-day stay gives time to explore the island, visit the evening food carts in Place Vai'ete or hop a ferry to dreamy Moorea across the channel.



Arutanga, Aitutaki and Avatiu, Rarotonga, Cook Islands

The Cook Islands boast stereotypical South Pacific appeal – in a good way. Verdant volcanic peaks are ringed by pure white beaches, limpid, candy-blue lagoons aglitter with vivid fish and creamy surf breaking on circling reefs. Friendly, colorful markets in Arutanga and Avatiu hold treasures like black pearls and crafts from outer isles. Your Expedition Team will offer activities and, if you're lucky, you may hear the islanders' heavenly, harmonious hymn-singing in one of their lovely white churches.



Neiafu, Vava'u and Nuku'alofa, Tongatapu, Tonga

Neiafu's protected harbor on Tonga's large coral island of Utu Vava'u is a favorite of yachtsmen. Ene'io, Tonga's only botanical gardens, is surrounded by farms producing pineapples and world-famous vanilla. Tonga's capital Nuku'alofa on large Tongatapu island has a Tonga Cultural Centre museum and craftsmen's complex and marvelously crafted stone tombs of past Tongan kings in the nearby village of Mu'a. Your Expedition Team offers options of snorkeling, cultural tours and more in friendly, fascinating Tonga.



Dravuni Island, Fiji

This tiny island in the Great Astrolabe Reef is a look at Fijian life. Most of the island's fewer than 200 residents are friendly and will be at the island jetty when your ship arrives, to greet you and offer everything from colorful wrap-around pareus to having a parrot perch on your shoulder for a picture. The island's highest peak is less than 150 feet in altitude but offers breathtaking views. Snorkeling is spectacular on the surrounding reefs.



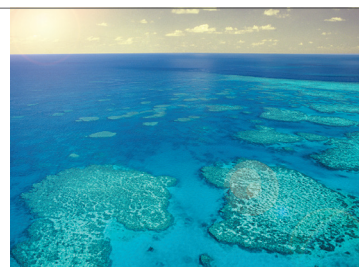
Alotau, Kitava and Conflict Islands, Papua New Guinea

One of the least explored places on earth, occupying half of New Guinea Island and small offshore islands, PNG's Melanesian people speak 851 languages and 40 percent live natural lifestyles unconnected to the world economy. They were discovered through wars and exploration. Learn about the WWII Battle of Milne Bay and visit traditional villages at Alotau. Visit idyllic, unspoiled Kitava in the Trobriand Islands and the coral Conflict Islands curved around a crystalline lagoon, encircled by one of the world's most biodiverse reefs.



Cairns, Australia

Sailing the Queensland coast, you will pass into one of nature's most extravagant displays – the massive, living Great Barrier Reef sprawling in immense, multicolored splendor beneath the warm waters of the Coral Sea. Cairns is a sophisticated city flanked by forests and golden beaches, and offers a chance to explore the Reef's vast, subaquatic ecosystem, teeming with vividly colored tropical fishes, or the nearby, primeval Daintree Rainforest National Park, both of which are inscribed UNESCO World Heritage sites.



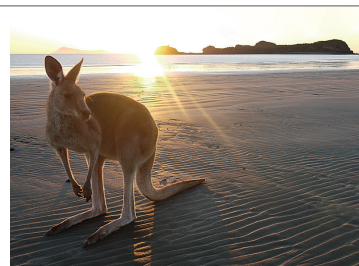
Melbourne, Australia (overnight)

Busy Melbourne's attitude shows in its distinctive capitol called 'The Beehive.' But it is truly a city of parks, lawns, arcades for strolling and the UNESCO World Heritage Site Royal Exhibition Hall and Carlton Gardens. Melbourne boomed in the Victorian gold rush, and by 1865 was the second-largest city in the British Empire. Today, Melbourne is ranked as one of the world's most livable cities, providing plentiful art, music, theater, dance and, of course, Australian Rules Football.



Adelaide and Kangaroo Island, Australia

South Australia's capital straddles the Torrens River with the Mount Lofty hills at its back and spectacular beaches nearby. The South Australian Museum holds the world's-largest collection of Aboriginal artifacts and the renowned wineries of the Barossa, Coonawarra, Eden and Clare valleys attract serious oenophiles. Kangaroo Island is a popular escape for wildlife and nature-lovers. Marine tours from Penneshaw seek porpoises and dolphins, and excursions visit koala and wallaby preserves, as well as local wineries.



Perth (Freemantle), Australia

Nowhere in Australia is the native Aussie penchant for fresh air and sport more visible. Blessed by sun and fresh breezes, Fremantle was heaven for competing America's Cup yachts. Up river, Perth is prosperous and fast-paced, but graced with ample parks and green spaces where a bloke can catch his breath. Climb to Kings Park for an overview. Then see the Aviation Heritage Museum, the Perth Mint's hourly gold bar pour, or ferry to see Penguin Island's fairy penguins.



Broome, Australia

Broome thrived based on the South Sea pearls in offshore oyster beds, though today most are cultured. The town boasts a splendid, 14-mile white sand beach and 2,600 islands that are a sportsman's paradise. But the unique allure is the unspoiled expanse of bizarre geological formations, rivers and ancient Aboriginal lands called the Kimberley. Corrugated with red-hued cliffs and escarpments, and laced with pristine waterways, swimming holes and waterfalls, the Kimberley is unlike any other landscape on earth.



Benoa (Denpasar), Bali (overnight)

Bali's beauty inspires spiritual serenity, and religion for most Balinese is a normal part of daily life. Innately artistic, their creative traditions reflect the beauty around them. All of this makes Bali an enchanting place to enjoy an overnight stay. Crafts villages such as Ubud specialize in jewelry, paintings, carvings and even sacrificial flower and fruit arrangements that all reflect Bali's serene and hospitable soul. Benoa's calm waters and beautiful white sand beaches have made it Bali's prime water sports area.



Surabaya and Semarang (Borobudur), Java, Indonesia

Indonesia's second-largest city, Surabaya is a thriving port teeming with colorful watercraft from all around the world and the archipelago. Points of interest include the 15th-century Grand Mosque, Mpu Tantular Museum of Javanese culture, and a Russian Submarine Monument known as Monumen Kapal Selam. Semarang on Java's north-central coast makes an ideal gateway to the spectacular UNESCO World Heritage Site of Borobudur, the largest Buddhist monument on earth, ringed by dense jungle and towering volcanic peaks.



Victoria, Mahé and Praslin, Seychelles

When Europeans stumbled across the Seychelles, scattered over the Indian Ocean, they suspected these idyllic islands were remnants of Lost Eden. Their climate is sublime, their people handsome and welcoming, and their beauty is legendary. We will visit the sleepy capital on coral Mahé island, and also the island of Praslin, with beaches lined with huge, photogenic granite boulders and the UNESCO World Heritage Vallée de Mai Nature Reserve, home to towering, thousand-year-old Coco-de-Mer palms.



Mombasa, Kenya (two overnights)

We'll linger in this ancient Swahili city on the Indian Ocean coast for three days, allowing guests to explore its colorful markets, Arab-influenced Old Town and the 16th-century Portuguese Fort Jesus UNESCO World Heritage Site, or opt for Seabourn Overland safari tours to Kenya's world-famous game parks. Other options include snorkeling at Mombasa Marine National Park, swimming at Diani Beach or shopping for handcrafts or swatches of vividly printed African fabrics at the Bombolulu Workshop.



Cape Town, South Africa (overnight)

The Mother City sprawls invitingly under the silhouette of Table Mountain. The Western Cape region offers diverse temptations from the world-famous gardens and wineries of Franshoek and Stellenbosch wine country to notorious Robben Island prison, the UNESCO World Heritage Site where Nelson Mandela was imprisoned. During your overnight stay, also visit the Cape of Good Hope, ascend Table Mountain by cable car for breathtaking views, shop for colorful Zulu beadwork and indulge in fresh seafood at a waterfront café.



Walvis Bay, Namibia (overnight)

The long, empty strands of beach and rusting shipwrecks give this shoreline its 'Skeleton Coast' nickname, but the dramatic, looming serpentine dunes of the Namib Sand Seas landscape is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Elephants and lions haunt the dunes, the ink-blue lagoons teem with white pelicans, pink flamingos, whales, dolphins and seals, and wildflowers blanket the shores. An overnight stay offers stargazing under 'Dark Skies' for a view of the heavens superior to virtually any other place on earth.



Dakar, Senegal

The Parisian-style boulevards of Dakar bespeak its French West African history, but its streets are vivid with fashionable Sénégalaise in their flowing Grands Boubous and elaborate turbans. Dakar is a center of a vibrant PanAfrican cultural movement reflected in music, art, fashion and literature. The Musée Théodore Monod displays artifacts from West African indigenous cultures, while the old slavers' fortress on Gorée Island tells a different, tragic tale. The old capital of Saint-Louis is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Praia, Ilha de Santiago and Mindelo, Ilha de São Vicente, Cape Verde

The Cape Verde islands were important during the Age of Discovery. Ribeira Grande on Santiago island was the first European colonial settlement in the tropics in 1466. Its pelourinho where slaves were sold is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The capital was moved higher to Praia to minimize pirate attacks. Mindelo on São Vicente island has a replica of Lisbon's Belém Tower near the fish market, with displays of historic artifacts and intriguing treasures recovered from numerous offshore shipwrecks.



Las Palmas and Arrecife (Lanzarote), Canary Islands, Spain

The Canary Islands lie just west of Morocco. In the age of sail, galleons paused here before catching prevailing winds to the New World. Visit the Casa de Colón Museum, or the Museo Canaria in Las Palmas for historic perspective. The city's oldest quarter, La Vegueta, is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Lanzarote, known as the "volcano island," has a surreal, lunar-like desert landscape. Its unique plant and animal adaptations have earned it UNESCO World Biosphere status.



Casablanca, Morocco

Morocco's largest city and one of Africa's most important business centers, Casablanca's port is the continent's largest artificial harbor and home to Morocco's Royal Navy. The impressive, seaside Hassan II Mosque is capable of holding 25,000 worshippers inside, and another 80,000 in the courtyard. Visit the partially restored Medina, the quaint old Moorish quarter, to better understand Moroccan culture, or opt for exciting longer excursions to ancient imperial Rabat or colorful Marrakech on a UNESCO Partner Tour.

Cruise fares do not include travel insurance and any incidental expenses including, but not limited to: laundry charges; spa and salon treatments; telephone and internet charges; medical services and select shore excursions.

GRATUITIES

Tipping is neither required nor expected on board.

EXCLUSIVE OCCUPANCY

The fare for a single traveler in a double occupancy suite is 200% of the per guest double occupancy fare. However, a single traveler savings program is offered on all ships and a limited number of suites may be set aside.

3RD/4TH GUEST

Cruise fares for the third guests are 50% of the per guest double occupancy fare for the booked category. Triple occupancy suites are subject to availability. All 3rd guest requests need prior approval from Revenue Management with the exception of the Grand Wintergarden Suites. Savings programs and value-add amenity promotions cannot be added to a 3rd or 4th guest as they already represent considerable savings.

The cruise fare for a Grand Wintergarden Suite includes all 4 lower berths. As a result, the cruise fare for the 3rd and 4th guest is zero while Taxes, Fees and Port Expenses (TF&PE) are additional.

MINOR GUESTS & MINIMUM AGE TO TRAVEL

Minors must be at least 6 months of age at the time of embarkation with a few exceptions:

- For transoceanic voyages, minors must be at least 1 year of age at the time of embarkation.
- For Antarctica or Expedition voyages, minors must be at least 6 years of age at the time of embarkation.

Minors who participate in select Expedition or Ventures by Seabourn shore excursions will negotiate a steep gangway and must be tall enough to sit on the side of small rubber landing boats (Zodiacs). They must be able to understand and immediately respond to any orders given by the people in charge and must be able to walk independently over uneven and slippery terrain ashore including but not limited to rocks, snow and ice. For the safety of all concerned, the Captain and Expedition Leader shall make the final determination regarding whether or not minors may participate in any excursion, taking into account weather, sea conditions and the difficulty of disembarking at each location visited.

The published per person fare applies to all minors traveling as the second guest in a suite. If the minor guest is sailing as a third guest in a Suite, the above third and fourth guests policy applies.

NON-COMMISSIONABLE FARE (NCF)

The Non-Commissionable Fare is included in the cruise fare but will appear as a separate line item on the invoice. Commission will not be paid on this portion of the cruise fare.

TAXES, FEES & PORT EXPENSES (TF&PE)

Taxes, fees & port expenses are in addition to the Cruise Fare and must be paid by all guests, including 3rd and 4th guests.
